If you have Missouri Medicaid: hearing test \$10, new hearing aid as low as \$35, hearing aid repair \$20. ## **Identification – Birth Certificates & Missouri ID's** **College Church**

Provides financial assistance for a Missouri State ID and birth certificate once applicant has presented necessary documents.

For an immediate birth certificate applicant must present a photo ID current within the last two years. If applicant does not have photo ID, application forms are available and birth certificates will be mailed within a few weeks.

For a new or renewal State ID applicant must present one document from each of the following categories below:

1. *Proof of Lawful Presence*: birth certificate, passport, certificate of citizenship, naturalization, or birth abroad.
  2. *Proof of Identity*: Social Security or Medicare Card.
  3. *Proof of Residency*: Official letter or document from a state or local government agency, official letter from shelter on official letterhead verifying applicant's residence at that shelter, voter registration card, bank statement, pay check, government check.
